Sat April 4th RambAle – A Trail of two Brewery Taps in the Loxley Valley

- a shortish walk from the Nags Head to the Wisewood Inn

Catch the **11:28 Blue or Yellow Tram** from Castle Square to the Hillsborough tram stop, crossing over to catch the **11:55 61 bus** as far as the Nags Head at Stacy Bank on the Loxley Road (B6077) arriving there around 12:15.

After a drink or two from the Bradfield Brewery, we shall wander down the Loxley Valley following the riverside path until branching off to the Wisewood Inn to try some of the Loxley Brewery beers available there.

People can then either stop there, catch a bus home or one down to Hillsborough corner and visit some of the micro pubs there before going home.

Sat May 16th RambAle – Bakewell, Stanton Moor & Darley Bridge

Catch **10:40 218** bus from Sheffield Interchange, arriving in Bakewell at 11:40. Catch the **12:20 172**, getting off at Stanton In Peak at 12:50.

Visit the **Flying Childers** pub.

Leaving there at **c13:30**, we shall walk over Stanton Moor via the Nine Ladies stone circle to Birchover.

We shall call in the Red Lion pub which is also the home of the the Birchover Brewery

At 15:30 we shall walk to Darley Bridge via Clough Lane

At 16:30 we shall call in the Three Stags Head in Darley Bridge then visit the nearby Square & Compass Inn.

At 17:30 catch the Sixer or TransPeak bus on the A6 in Darley Dale back to Bakewell. And then catch the 218 back to Sheffield.

PLEASE NOTE: All bus, tram & train times are subject to change and last minute cancellation.

Please check before setting off. And walk timings are approximate.
